ROLE SUMMARY:

The first Habitat ReStores in Europe are delivering real impacts for local people and the wider community in Dublin, Lisburn, Drogheda, Belfast, Ballymena, Lisnagelvin, Newry & Newtownards. ReStore, the charity's social enterprise, builds sustainable community and directly tackles poverty here in Ireland. ReStore enables local people to improve their homes for less, provides learning opportunities for volunteers from different abilities and backgrounds, and diverts tons of reusable waste from landfill

Working with volunteers the Donation Collection Driver will be responsible for the collection of donated materials, safely packing in the ReStore truck, returning to ReStore and unpacking. They will work alongside volunteers to assemble and display items on the shopfloor and will deputise for the ReStore Manager to ensure excellent customer service in ReStore.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

ReStore Operations

- Screen donations to ensure suitability for sale in ReStore
- Load and unload all donated materials
- As needed, assemble donated furniture and display in store
- Communicating with ReStore Manager regarding incoming donations.
- Supervising and supporting volunteers of all ages, abilities and backgrounds; helping to ensure their experience is meaningful.
- Maintain an effective working relationship with Habitat staff, volunteers and ReStore customers/donors.
- Process cash, credit card and cheque transactions, following established procedures for each type of sale.
- Answer customer queries and provide relevant information
- Maintain a clean, safe and presentable store at all times, including display of sale items and storage of donated stock.

Health and Safety

- Comply with all current legislation regarding acceptance of donations and sale of goods

7. Committed to the vision, mission and values of Habitat for Humanity; humility, courage and accountability and demonstrate a working style that reflects these.
